CALL CURRICULA

Call to Communion, *Call to Reconciliation* and *Call to Service* are catechist manuals for special sacramental preparation designed for three developmental levels from low verbal expression to higher levels of reasoning: readiness, preparation, and sacramental living. Each Call manual has a Supplement for student activities including simple line drawings which can either be a tool for the catechist or a personal book for the student. These curricula are family-oriented and may be used in the home, in self contained groups or for one-on-one teaching of children who have difficulty with group work in catechesis. Sixty lessons have been developed for each of the sacraments: Eucharist, Reconciliation and Confirmation beginning with readiness lessons for each. Immediate preparation and follow-up sessions related to each sacrament take into account both psychological and spiritual development of children with cognitive disabilities.

Lessons give suggestions to the parent or inexperienced catechist, simple suggested activities to reinforce learning, scripted dialogue and appropriate prayer services. A set of notes for parents provides guidance to those who nurture each lesson between classes and who lead the child from lessons to prayer.

Call to Communion, Haskett, Sheila *et alia*

At the most basic level, *the Call to Communion* introduces the child to communion with God through prayer. The second level of instruction celebrates the meaning and manner of sacramental meeting with Jesus in the Eucharist. At the more developed level, youth are encouraged to adopt a life of prayerful communion.

Call to Reconciliation, Haskett, Sheila *et alia*

Lessons in the *Call to Reconciliation* encourage the student to accept God's gifts gratefully and to recognize times when these gifts have been misused. The catechist who works with young people leads them to expressions of sacramental reconciliation and to a life of generous thanksgiving.

Call to Service, Haskett, Sheila *et alia*

Sixty lessons related to Service suggest a call to the social dimensions of our Confirmation. The lessons import from the Rite itself a call to Christian maturity. The basic level familiarizes the student with Mary, the perfect responder to God, and the more advanced level examines the implications of the Confirmation, "Yes."

GOSPEL STUDY, Haskett, Sheila *et alia*

Developmentally challenged youth and adults can ponder the Sunday Gospel readings of the three-year lectionary and can be led to simple expressions of discipleship based on the call of the Gospel passage. Plans are provided for 32 Sundays for each of the three years together with simple line drawings of illustrating each Gospel setting in supplemental binders, and accompanying paraliturgies. Each lesson has a consistent sharp focus on a single theme and message in order to promote retention and application in the day-to-day living of the developmentally disabled adult. The lessons are intended to be repeated in succeeding years. There are lessons for special religious and secular holidays.
